Absolute 58 Fly masters rough waters. Here's our test

Gray sky, wind, chopped sea. It's the best situation for most boaters to...stay safe in the harbor. But we're here for a sea trial, so we have to take Absolute 58 Fly for a spin. And it's worth it.

The hull is responsive and well powered. Absolute 58 Fly is the perfect cruising buddy

The test model is powered by the **600 HP Volvo Penta IPS 800**, good enough to be the only alternative. So it comes to not surprise that the boat is **immediately responsive and puts the driver at ease**. The sea conditions do not recommend violent maneuvers, but even facing the waves in all directions the **hull is always ready**, with some loud thud only in the more complex crosses. The sturdiness of the entire structure makes her feel solid and well built, but it doesn't limit performance: **30 knots of maximum speed** are a good result indeed. Perhaps the **turn is quite wide** considering that the IPS are used to rather narrow rays, but it is no big deal, as the sea conditions are bad, and in the end with these transmissions electronics can be tuned according to the manufacturer's need.



Let's talk about fuel consumption. Beside the top speed figure, at the pace that we reckon to be the perfect cruise for Absolute 58 Fly, which is **20 to 25 knots**, the numbers give a good response: **154 to 185 liters per hour, with the better at 21, although the longest range seems to be at 30 knots with 229 nautical miles, which means 0,14 nm per liter.** The minimum planing speed is 12 knots at 1900 revs, with the engines burning 100 lph (or 0,12 nm per liter). So in the end it's good to speed up a bit.

A perfect match between performance and luxury

Our test was run during the world premiere organized by the shipyard in **Trieste, northern Italy.** A big event indeed, considering the number of journalists coming from allover Europe.





Absolute 58 Fly in a nutshell

For an accurate description of the boat's interiors and main features, *check our previous article*. Here I just want to add some peculiar facts.

• First of all, the **galley** which is located just at the entrance of the salon, by the cockpit. As the flybridge overhang is quite long above the cockpit itself, the whole area can be enjoyed even in unfair weather. The **sliding door** opens in an instant and creates a unique space.



• The **control panel** is not hidden at all, on the contrary it's handy and even good to look under a protective glass. The **dashboard** finally drops any round gauges and sports only digital screens. The **side door** is great for getting in and out and will be perfect when mooring, as it makes so quick to reach the **cockpit maneuvering joystick**.



• The lower deck features the same attention to quality, design and finishing of the materials. The **three cabins** are bright and rational, with the **master stateroom** amidships, the VIP to bow and a third one with twin beds in between.





• Full marks also for the exterior spaces: solarium and a sofa on the foredeck, and a large flybridge with traditional layout on top.
